Dr. Tabea Springstein studies how people differ in their experiences and regulation of emotions in day-to-day life and how these processes evolve with age.



Dr. Alejandra Arce investigates resilience and resistance among immigrant and BIPOC youth in the context of oppression. She aims to translate findings into strengths- and community-based prevention interventions.



Dr. Olivia Atherton investigates how self-regulation develops across the lifespan, how it is shaped by sociocultural contexts, and the impacts it has on mental and physical health.



Dr. Gene Brewer investigates sustained attention, attention control, working memory, long-term memory, and general intellectual abilities in both applied and theoretical contexts.



Dr. Holly O'Rourke is an applied statistician who studies statistical models and methods for behavior change over time with a focus on health and substance use. She will be starting January 2025.

Dr. Bob Rosenthal

University and Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Psychology Bob Rosenthal passed away on Jan 5, 2024.

Bob was a huge part of our community for nearly a quarter century, having joined our Department following his retirement from Harvard in 1999. His accomplishments and accolades are too numerous to detail, but highlights include his induction as a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, his Lifetime Achievement award from the American Psychological Association, his receipt of the James McKeen Cattell Award from the American Society for Psychological Science, and his recognition as just one of ~40 University Professors appointed since 1960 across the entire UC System. In addition to being among the most eminent psychologists of the 20th century for his work on self-fulfilling prophecies (i.e., the Pygmalion or Rosenthal Effect), non-verbal communication, and research methods, Bob was a devoted husband to his late wife Marylu (for whom he dedicated the "MaryLu Clayton Rosenthal Dance Studio" at UCR), a beloved father and grandfather, an amazing colleague, a generous friend, and a person of utmost integrity, ingenuity, and humility. He will be dearly missed.
